X**<**# - OPEN CIRCLE, SHADE LEFT X > # - OPEN CIRCLE, SHADE RIGHT


X ≤ # - CLOSED CIRCLE, SHADE LEFT

X≥# - CLOSED CIRCLE, SHADE RIGHT


Note: equivalent inequalities - have the same solutions


